

## Conference Abstract Submission Guidelines

Presenters must submit a one-page single-spaced summary of finished research ready to be discussed. As a heading to your submission, include Your Name & Affiliations, Co-Author's Name & Affiliations, Title of the Research Paper, and contact information including your Email and Mailing Address.

In this conference abstract, you need to include the following:

1. A statement of your research question and main findings.
2. Any or all of the following, where appropriate:
  - a. An indication of your paper's economic model (or new method) with references (author, year of publication) to prior work on which you build.
  - b. Research strategies used to evaluate your model prediction's congruence with the real world: Estimation? Simulation? Experimental evidence?
  - c. Your proposed method's improvement over existing methods.
  - d. Research resources and data sources critical to your project's completion.
  - e. Project's limitations and areas for further work.
3. Finally, provide:
  - a. The Journal of Economic Literature (JEL) 2-digit subject classification code in which this work falls, and
  - b. Two or three additional keywords that may assist others interested in this sub-field of economics to find your paper.
